

What kinds of activities should I log on Inkpath?

You should add any activities that you think contribute to your PhD study, research, and professional development. The list below gives you an idea of the kind of activities we would like you to record, although it is not exhaustive.

Activity	Example
Generic skills courses	Writing skills, presentation skills, project management, negotiating
Academic skills courses	Teaching, making conference presentations, writing grant applications
Research-related courses	Research methods, theory, conducting literature reviews
Language courses	3 week intensive course in Spanish
Attendance at: Conference/exhibition/performance/workshop specifically in area of research	Conferences etc. focussed on the student's research topic which do not broaden research skills.
Conference/Exhibition/Performance – assisting on the day	Helping with conference registration or setting up exhibition
Conference/Exhibition/Performance – organiser	Membership of conference organising committee
Conference/Exhibition/Performance – submission of abstract or proposal	
Conferences /Exhibition/Performance presentation	Presentation of conference paper or poster or participation in performance
Publications (or equivalent practice-related output) – submission of paper or book chapter	
Peer review of articles	
Work placements or work-related projects	Helping a Techne Partner organisation over a 6 month period with research for an exhibition
Shadowing	Shadowing a member of staff at a Techne Partner organisation
Volunteering/Impact/Social Engagement	Giving a talk on research area at local school or local radio

Committee membership	Representing students on Techne Management Group or PGR students on University Committee
